RETHINKWASTE ANNOUNCES FOURTH ANNUAL “TRASH TO ART” CONTEST
3rd Through 6th Grade Classes and Individual Students in Service Area Invited to Participate

SAN CARLOS, CA - January 12, 2016 – RethinkWaste is inviting students and teachers to get creative and give trash a new meaning through its fourth annual “Trash to Art” Contest. The contest is open to all 3rd to 6th grade classes in the RethinkWaste service area and will feature a special category for individual students.

“This year we are excited to expand the contest to include 3rd grade classes and individual students too! We can’t wait to see all the artwork,” said RethinkWaste Environmental Education Coordinator Faustina Mututa. “Over the years, we have received amazing, creative art pieces that showcase the imagination of students and teachers in our community.

For the class category, art pieces must be made as a class effort. Individual 3rd-6th grade students can submit art piece(s) for the individual category. Approximately 90% of the art must be made from recyclable or non-recyclable materials collected at home, school and everyday life. All mediums of artwork are encouraged, including sculptures, collages and murals, among others. Art pieces should not exceed 3 feet x 3 feet in size and must meet at least one of the following requirements: frame-able, weather resistant, can stand alone and easily transported by one person.

Artwork must be submitted by 5 pm on April 1, 2016 to the Environmental Education Center at the Shoreway Environmental Center, 333 Shoreway Road, San Carlos. Winning art pieces will be announced on April 8, 2016 and recognized at the RethinkWaste Earth Day event on April 23, 2016. Artwork will also be displayed at the Environmental Education Center as part of an educational exhibit. Prizes will be awarded for each category as follows:
